IV. Presentation on the Advanced Registered Nurse Education Programs in Kansas

- b. The committee had discussions on how to compile and present the information to accurately reflect the ARNP programs. Carol offered to revise the report and include trend data for the past several years.

V. Identified Barriers

- a. The KSBN does not have funding to track graduate nurses but would be open to discussing retrieving this data as part of the implementation grant.
- b. Preceptors are in high demand by all of the primary health care programs. Because this is a volunteer activity which requires the health care professional to spend a lot of time with the student, it can slow down professional's practice. Additionally, preceptors are needed in specific specialties to help train the primary care student. Programs attempt to offer the student choices in where they would like to complete their clinical rotations. This forces each program to attempt to find preceptors in locations crisscrossing the state. All programs are always attempting to find more preceptors.
